Reflections of Life

Omar George St. Patrick “Custos” Stewart was born to Mr. and Mrs. Lloyd and Joan Stewart on March 15, 1974 in the parish of St. Andrew, Jamaica, West Indies. He grew up in the parish of St. Catherine where he attended St. Catherine Catholic Primary school and the Spanish Town Secondary School; where he received his diploma in Electrical Installation.

As a child he loved to sing Christmas carols especially, “O Holy Night.”

Omar was trained as a full time photographer in techniques of video production by the Daily News in Jamaica, W.I. He worked in that field at Robatham’s Photo Studio in Spanish Town, Jamaica, W.I. In 1995 he was baptized and became a member of a Church of God in Jamaica, W.I.

Omar was a man of diverse talents, which reflected in his career as a bus driver, photographer, and dietary aide. This young man had an explorative mind and was a very determined individual, who accomplished whatever he set his sights on.

Omar was trained in Integrated Auto Mechanics at Advanced Driving Training Center, which was operated by the British Government in Jamaica, W.I. As a result, he drove for the Jamaica Urban Transportation Corporation (JUTC).

He migrated to the United States of America, with his son, Dimitri Stewart in 2007. Upon his arrival in the USA, he worked for Care One at the Cupola in Ridgewood, NJ, as a dietary aide for a short while. He then went on to work for Coach USA as a bus driver, and shortly thereafter was promoted as a supervisor in the safety department.

Omar had a special love for driving and was a motorcycle enthusiast. He took his last breath, doing exactly what he loved. He stepped out of time into eternity, when he had a fatal motorcycle accident.

He was preceded in death by his father, Lloyd Stewart in 1991.

He leaves to cherish memories: his beloved son, Dimitri of Paterson, NJ; his loving mother, Rev. Joan Stewart of Paterson, NJ; sisters, Jackie of Paterson, NJ and Judith of Jamaica, W.I.; brothers, Junior and Marlon of Jamaica, W.I.; nephew, Nasir of Paterson, NJ; Aunty Sher of Paterson, NJ; Aunty Iris of New York; Jadine of Jamaica, W.I.; a host of nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles and cousins in Jamaica, W.I. a ton of friends and well wishers.
