### <u>Obituary</u>

**Sister Wilma Ree Haynes** was born on November 24, 1941 to the late Peter Haynes, Sr. and the late Anna Haynes in Ravenell, SC. She was the youngest girl of twelve children. She was preceded in death by one brother, (Levi) and three sisters, (Lavenia, Dorothy, and Rosa). She was affectionately called "Marie" by family and close friends. She received her formal education in the school systems of Charleston, SC. In 1957, at the tender age of fifteen, she relocated to New York City at the request of her sister Thelma Haynes Brown who relocated to New York shortly before. Upon moving to New York, she continued her education by attending Washington Irving High School and obtained her H.S. diploma. Her first job after high school was as a dietician aide at New York Hospital where she worked for several years, and then she obtained a position at the United States Postal Service where she worked for over forty years until she retired.

She attended the Greater Refuge Temple Church and received the precious gift of the Holy Ghost on July 18, 1957. Sister Haynes served the Lord for over fifty-six years. She quickly began operating in her gifts and talents by working in the ministry. She also gave of her time to help out with the Repass Committee whenever there was a funeral.

Wilma was a woman of many gifts, talents and a jack of all trades. She was a master seamstress and she took pride in her work. She made many of the uniforms for the Young Adult Usher Board, Youth Ushers and the Jr. Usherettes.

She was crafty and skilled in crocheting and knitting. She crocheted hats worn by the Young Adult Ushers Board, the Youth Ushers and various other churches. She designed and sewed the capes that are adorned by our Mother's Board and she also made the curtains that are hung in the social hall and nursery for its grand re-opening. She was very handy at fixing things that were otherwise considered "unrepairable". She was the only one of her siblings who had a "green thumb" a gift she inherited from her father who worked in a plant nursery. She could grow any type of plant or flower and grew many fruits and vegetables right on her apartment balcony.

She loved to help people in any way she could. She gave of herself in a way that was unlike any other. It was hard for her to tell people "no" even if the task was a lot to take on. She loved spending time with her family. Whenever there was a family gathering, there she would be. She was kind but also firm. She spoke her mind when it was warranted. She had a great listening ear and gave sound advice. She was a mother to many of her nieces and nephews and godchildren. She was greatly loved and will be sorely missed.
