Elisha Davis, Jr., was born on January 30, 1932 in Belhaven, North Carolina to the late Elisha Davis, Sr. and Ellen Tyler Davis. Elisha married Mary V. Peterson and from this union there were three children, Denise, Reginald and Eric.

At the age of twelve he began working at odd jobs, cleaning and making deliveries for the local grocery store. He used his earnings to visit his uncle in New York City. Elisha graduated from Belhaven High School (BHS) in June of 1949, where he loved playing basketball. After graduation he bought a ticket from Trailways Bus Company and moved to New York where he began working for the Button Factory, earning enough money to rent a room for five dollars a week.

At the Button Factory, Elisha learned of a program where he could attend school to learn a trade and work simultaneously. He then worked at the Bolton Printing Company half-days while and attending the New York School of Printing until he was drafted into the United States Army. He fought in the Korean War from January 1953 to November 1954, earning four medals: the Bronze Star, Combat Badge, United Nation Service and National Defense Service, after which he was honorably discharged.

Upon his return from the Korean War, Elisha completed a four-year certificate program at the New York School of Printing. He was the first African-American to work as a Pressman at the Altum Printing Press Company from 1954 to 1975. He continued his career and was promoted to become the first African-American Foreman at Claire Printing Company until its closing in 1988, after which he retired.

Elisha was affectionately known to his dear friends by the nickname "SMOKEY".

Elisha was a member of Mt. Nebo Baptist Church for the past sixteen years, who had great wisdom and knowledge of the Bible. Although he lost his sight, it never stopped his commitment to attending church service every Sunday, making the pilgrimage from Astoria, Long Island City to Harlem. It was evident in his dedication that he truly loved the Lord.

Elisha leaves cherished memories with: his wife, Mary; their three children, Denise Cheryl Davis, Reginald Davis and Eric Davis; three grandchildren, La' Vonne Martel Davis, Ebony Davis and Taylor Davis; four sisters, Ellavise Roger and Trude Elizabeth Kirby both of whom pre-deceased him, Mary Gladys Hallett (NYC) and Velma Murray of Belhaven, North Carolina; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
