Obituary

Emma Lillie Howell (86) was born on December 1, 1926 in Jacksonville, Florida to the late Parthenia Reeves Howell and Charlie Howell, Sr.

Emma graduated St. Francis School of Nursing and enlisted in the U.S. Army as a First Lt. She was called to active service from the reserves and served in Korea in the MASH unit as a general duty nurse and retired from active duty in 1958. She completed a three year course in nursing while in the military. She received an honorable discharge with the following decoration; Korean Service Medal, United Nations Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal.

Upon leaving the U.S. Military Emma was employed by the Jersey City Medical Center in 1964 and held the position of Certified Nurse Anesthetist for thirty-nine years, at one point being the Chief Nurse Anesthetist. She retired in 2003.

Emma was very work oriented, talented with gifts she was blessed with by God, She was loved by her co-workers and often doctors requested that she be apart of the team when they needed surgery. Emma was a very caring and loving soul "who did her way".

Preceding her in death are her sisters: Mary Harrison and Doris Jackson, her brothers, Oliver Robbins, Preston Robbins, Charlie Howell Jr., Amos Howell, Joseph Williams, and Hymie Howell.
