Obituary

Daisy Lee was born in Charleston, South Carolina to the late Sonny and late Margaret White on March 31, 1922. She was preceded in death by two brothers, Samuel White, and Billy Watson; and two sisters, Elizabeth Adams, and Blulette Hester only to join them on November 22, 2013.

Daisy attended Buist School then graduated from Burke Industrial High School. April 30, 1941 she married Oswald H. Johnson. From that union she had two daughters, Rosa E. Johnson, and Irene M. Johnson whom have preceding her in death.

In 1948, Daisy came to New York City where she found a church home at St. Matthews Baptist Church at 43 Macombs Place. Under the direction and bible teachings of Sister K.
