Ruth was born on April 27, 1921 in Johnston, SC and raised in Newark, New Jersey where she graduated from Barringer High School in 1938. It was at Barringer that Ruth met the love of her life, the late John Garrett, *Jr. Ruth and John*, married and from that union a son was born, John Kenneth. Ruth and John raised their son in Montclair for fifty-six years. Ruth accepted Christ and was baptized at an early age and became a member of Trinity Presbyterian Church of Montclair. Ruth was a quiet soul, but she had a very strong presence once you got to know her. A graduate of Montclair State University, Ruth was a budget analyst at the Bayonne Navy Yard for twenty-five years before retiring. Ruth was an avid bridge player.
