Uelysee Edwards Scantling (Stud) was born in Furman, South Carolina on June 16, 1925, to Nathan and Maggie Scantling. His parents departed from his life in 1925 (Mother) and 1928 (Dad). Rosa Scott (Grandmother) raised him until her death in 1937. Other family members raised Uelysee until his commitment to the United States Navy (Jacksonville, Fl) on October 20, 1943. His service to his country was as Seaman First Class in Yorktown, VA (USNKD) and Earle, NJ (USNAD). He received his Honorable Discharge Navy (Jacksonville, Fl) on May 29, 1946, then he moved to Paterson New Jersey.
