

The Obituary



Edgar J. Murdaugh, lovingly remembered as "Eddie", was born on January 27, 1954 in Brooklyn, NY at Kings County Hospital to Erma Murdaugh and Edgar J. Murdaugh.

Eddie attended Erasmus Hall High School in Brooklyn, NY. He later attended Adelphi Business School, in Brooklyn, NY where he studied Accounting. Eddie worked in various administrative accounting and bookkeeping fields including noteworthy positions held at Time and Life Magazine, Equitable Life Insurance, and the VA Hospital.

As sole proprietors of a record store, his parents encouraged Eddie's love of music by exposing him to popular jazz and blues artists. At the age of five he played music at his parents parties. Although he was too young to read, Eddie recognized the artist by the record labels.

Eddie began his professional DJ career in 1975. At the age of eighteen he brought his first set of turntables and played at bars spinning records for tips. To widen his listening audience, Eddie sold cassette tapes of his music. People recognized his talents and his notoriety as DJ Eddie skyrocketed. His collection of records and knowledge of music was prolific. He possessed the uncanny ability to take his listeners on a musical journey through time and space. DJ Eddie was a celebrity in the New York City bars and clubs. His informal house parties were legendary and created found memories for all who attended.

Although Eddie battled a life altering condition, he did not allow the condition to alter his life. He was a traveling man always sharply dressed often up with the sun and gone with the wind doing the things he loved. Whether on excursions to Atlantic City or walking along the streets of New York City he was determined to lead an active lifestyle and treasured every moment spent with dear family and friends. Eddie's outgoing personality and infectious laugh endeared him to many people over the years. His optimism, endurance and inner strength was an inspiration to everyone who knew him.

Eddie departed this life peacefully on February 6, 2014 at home. As he makes his departure Eddie leaves to cherish his memories: his beloved mother, Erma Robinson; his brothers, Clyde Murdaugh and Carl Robinson; his sisters, Sylvia Murdaugh and Sharon Diacheysn; and his special sister, Joreatha Howard. He was preceded in death by his father, Jeffrey Robinson. He also leaves behind a host of loving aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, and dear friends.
