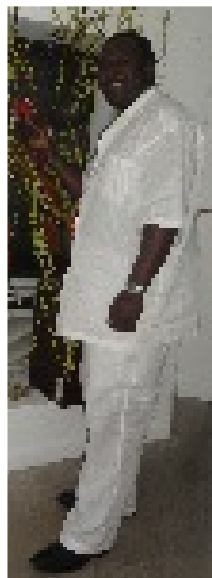
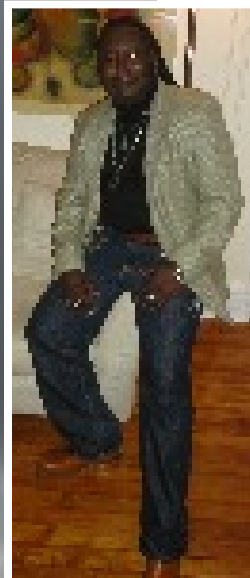

Kevin Dacosta Catwell was born April 9, 1970 on the beautiful Island of Barbados. He was the only son of the phenomenal Onel E. Griffith (formerly Onel Codrington) of Frenches, St. George and the charming Kevin D. Catwell, Sr. of Church Village, St. Phillip. Both parents currently reside in Plainfield, NJ.

Kevin was only 6lbs at birth, but grew up to be a very robust young man, excelling in track and field and soccer while in school. Kevin's education started at St. George Primary, St. Phillip Primary, Wesley Hall Junior, and Ellerslie Secondary Schools.

Kevin immigrated to the United States in July 1983, to live with his father and stepmother, Melda Catwell in Plainfield, NJ. He attended Maxon Middle School where he honed his track and field skills and continued his athletic prowess for the next
