Obituary

Billy Eugene Brown, affectionately known as “Uncle PETE” by his family and friends, was the youngest of four children born to the late Joseph E. Brown and Camelia Deal Brown on August 27, 1933 in Hickory, North Carolina.

Uncle PETE departed this life on Tuesday, February 19, 2014.

Pete was educated in the public schools of Hickory, NC and graduated from Ridgeview High School in 1952, where he earned a basketball scholarship to Maryland State College, also a basketball scholarship to attend Vookee College.

Pete was drafted into the ARMY from 1956 to 1957, served in KOREA CONFLICT, and was given an HONORABLE discharge from the United States Military. After his discharge, Pete relocated to New York City. There he worked in the garment district for eighteen years, then went on to work for Harlem Hospital for another eighteen years in the Pediatric department and retired from Harlem Hospital in 1996.

Pete then met his future wife Agnes Brown, whom he lovingly called his “Lil GIRL”, from that union two sons were born, Sean Anthony Brown and Tyrel Dante Brown. He also has a son name Terrance Canteen from a previous relationship.

Pete was a loving husband, father, brother and grandfather. For those who knew him, knew him as a loving, kind and generous person who enjoyed life to the fullest and being surrounded by his family and friends.
