Whatever you did to console our hearts, We Thank You, Whatever the part.

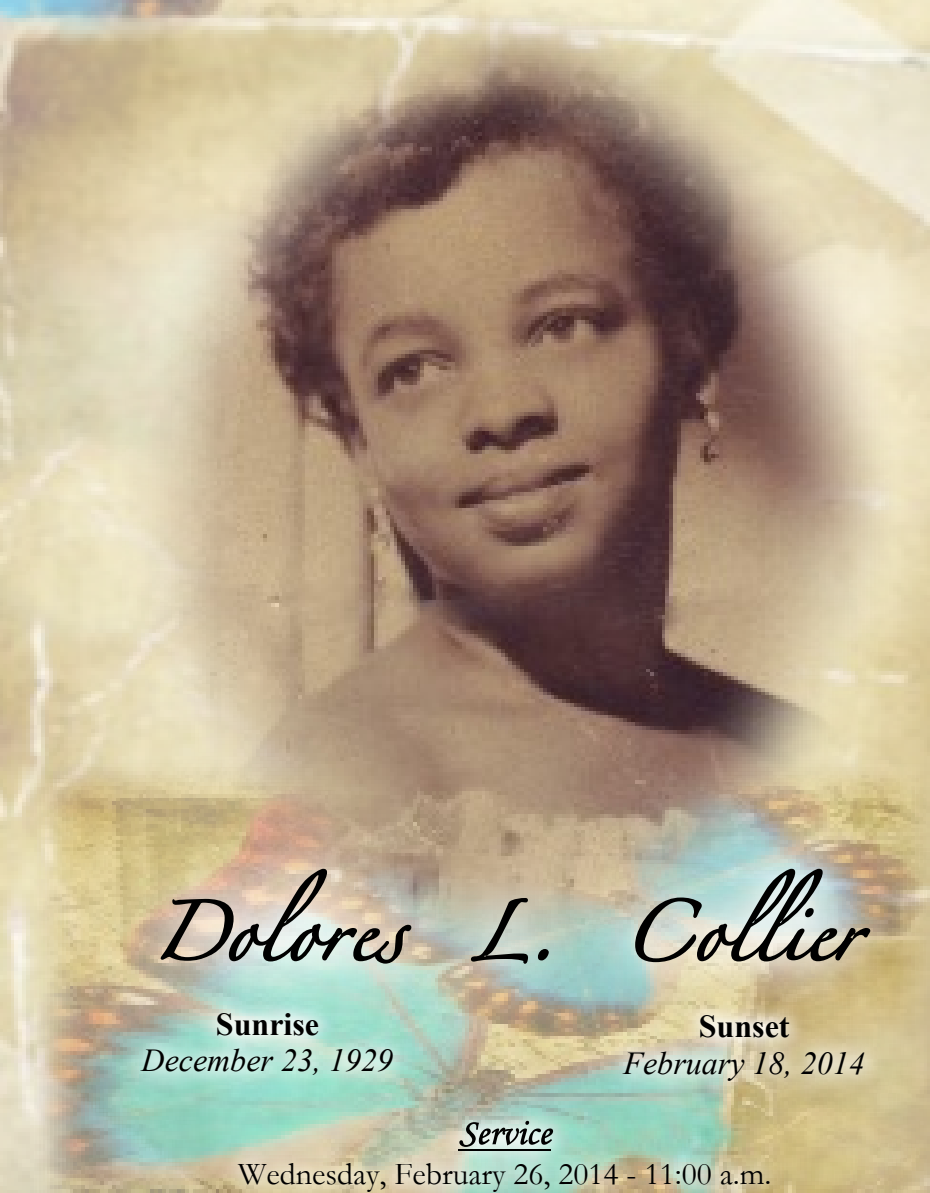
