A Time to be Born

John Clinton Ralph was born in Rahway, New Jersey on August 13, 1928, the first of three children of the late John and Clara (Alston) Ralph.

A Time to Grow

John grew up in Rahway, NJ; Harlem, NY and Bayonne, NJ. When his Dad passed early in his life, he left high school in the tenth grade in order to support his mother, brother and sister. In his later years, when his oldest child was a college freshman, he was motivated to return to night school and earn his G.E.D.

A Time to Love

John was joined in Holy Matrimony to the late Lila Mae (Fleming) Ralph on January 29, 1950 at Christ the King Church in Jersey City, New Jersey. From that union, eight (8) children were born: Michele Theresa, Michael Clinton, John Kevin, Patrick Kimuri, the late Anthony David, Patricia Anne, Lynn Diane and Brian Dominic. **John** was a quiet man who was dedicated to his family. He did his very best to ensure that his children had all that he could possibly provide.

A Time to Worship

John was a member of Christ the King Church in Jersey City and St. Vincent's in Bayonne. In 1959, the Ralph family moved to Newark and joined the Blessed Sacrament community, where all eight (8) children graduated from the parish's grammar school. All of the children went on to attend Catholic high schools.

A Time to Toil

John had an impeccable work ethic. During all of his working years, it was a rare occurrence for him to just take off from work. He was employed by the Ajax Division of Colgate-Palmolive Company for close to 35 years. He began his career on the factory line where he worked overtime (i.e., 16 hours per day) at every opportunity. He was Shop Steward for his union, promoted to Foreman and was subsequently elevated to Superintendent. Never one for idle time, upon his retirement from Colgate in 1984, **John** immediately secured employment with Equitable Life Insurance Company, where he worked in their Mail Room until his second retirement in 1995.

A Time for Fun and Friends

Upon moving his family to Newark's South Ward in 1959, **John** immediately took advantage of his beloved Woodland Avenue playground. He could be depended on to play basketball every Sunday after Mass. It was there that he earned the moniker "Hatchet Man" for the *delicate* way in which he played defense on the basketball court. He had a sweet jump shot from the top of the key that was admired by many...even his sons and their friends! Also an avid football and basketball fan, John maintained an unwavering loyalty to the New York Jets and the New York Knicks...win or lose...he was right there for them.

Pretty much the self-taught man, **John** had several hobbies to keep himself busy. He was a voracious reader, who read at least three different newspapers on a daily basis. On the rare occasion he was unable to obtain his newspapers, he would read National Geographic, encyclopedias or the dictionary if he didn't feel like reading one of his ever-present books. He also maintained one of the prettiest front lawn gardens on Weequahic Avenue. Each and every season the appropriate flowers were potted and/or planted.

John was the quintessential "Jack of All Trades". He did not believe in calling in the "professionals" for repairs. He fixed everything himself. He was a firm believer that "if you can read...you can do anything"...just follow the instructions. He taught his youngest daughter how to use a sewing machine. He was the parent who took all of the children on the block bike-riding in Weequahic Park. He also loved building model ships with the most intricate details and designs.
