Marvin Delvin St. Clair Holmes, Sr. was born on June 18, 1920 in Christ Church, Virginia son of Virginia Walker Holmes and Nestor Holmes. On May 5, 1938, he graduated from Middlesex High School in Locust Hill, Virginia. He then attended Virginia State College until 1941 when he was called to serve his country in the United States Army. He later settled in Plainfield, New Jersey where he resided until his passing.

Marvin worked at Bell Telephone Laboratories and AT&T for 29 years until he retired as a Supervisor of Shipping and Receiving in 1984.

Marvin received christ at an early age at Calvary Baptist Church in Christ Church Virginia and was a devoted steward at Second Baptist Church in Roselle, New Jersey singing with the Men's Chorus, serving as trustee and he had also been president of the Men's Club. He was a little league coach for the Teppers Tigers of the Kiwanis league in the late 1960's and early 1970's. He was an avid bowler, loved working in his garden and loved fishing.

Marvin S. Holmes Sr. passed away on Saturday, March 15, 2014 in Edison, New Jersey at the age of 93. He was predeceased by his parents, Virginia and Nestor Holmes, his brothers, Sherman Sr., Courtney, Carroll, John and Edward, and sisters, Edna and Cordova...
