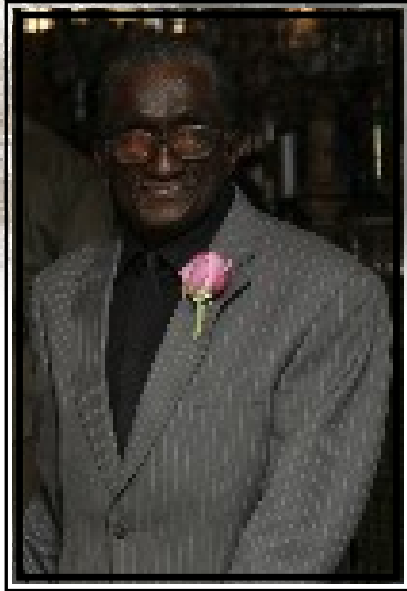

Reflections of Life

WALTER THOMAS PRICE, was born on September 8, 1929 in Snow Hill, Maryland to the union of Walter Price and Bertha Finney. He was one of six siblings.

“June,” as he was affectionately called by his friends, was educated in the Maryland School system and graduated from Worcester High School. He faithfully served his country in the Korean War and sometime after his discharge from the U.S. Army, he relocated to Newark, NJ.

In November 1962, Walter married the love of his life, Ruth Virginia Drumgo, at which time there was a seamless blending of their families.

Walt was a friend to everyone he met. He was generous to a fault – if you asked and he had it, it was yours. Once the weather was nice, you would find him in Weequahic Park hanging out with his buddies. He went to Kearney’s house to shave (no one else could tolerate the Magic Shave); he talked to Jamaal 20 times a day; to Uncle Charles every day. Walt Lee is his twin and Ike was the one who was there when he needed to *dress to impress*. Wherever Janet was preaching it was not unusual to see him finding an inconspicuous seat in the back of the church. When his wife went home to be with the Lord, he made Jo and Lamar’s house his home and he was *happy* leaving his crumbs on the counter. His connection with “Big Jahaan” was solid and unbreakable and “Little Jahaan” could get his “Pop” to do *whatever* he wanted even if it meant they both got into trouble.

Walter was preceded in death by his wife, Ruth V. Price and his three sisters, Viola, Ophelia and Geraldine. His leaves to mourn his passing: his children, Kearney, Janet Montford (Roy), Walter Lee, Isaac and Anthony a/k/a Jamaal; his brothers, Charles Fisher and Andrew Fisher (and his brother by choice, Charles Russell); his grandchildren, Joharisha Evans (Lamar), Wytonya Thompson (deceased) and Jenell Ross; his great-grandsons, Jahaan Wray, Todd Thompson and Lamar Evans; his great-great grandchildren, Jahaan Wray and Tadasia Thompson; as well as a host of nieces, nephews, family and friends.
