Throughout her life, she enjoyed many activities: including girl Scouts, traveling, crocheting, gardening, and devoting much time with her children and grandchildren.

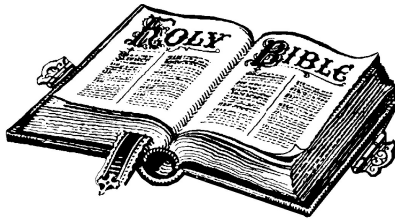
