Obituary

Ronald Powell, was born in New York City on December 14, 1960, to the late Mildred and Perry Powell. At an early age, he accepted Christ and was Baptised at the Mott Haven Reformed Church in the Bronx, NY. He was called home on Wednesday, April 23, 2014 at the age of 53.

Ronald was affectionately known as "Bear". Bear was raised in the Patterson Houses in the South Bronx. He received his secular education from the New York Public Schools. He attended and graduated from Elijah D. Clark Junior High School in the Bronx, NY. During his early teen years, Bear moved to Newport News, VA where he graduated from Ferguson High School. Bear completed a course for the "Black Christian Education Ministry" he earned a Certificate of Training for "Black Leadership Development" from the Mott Haven Reformed Church Educational Ministry. Their moto was "If You Don't Know, Learn; If You Know, Teach".

In 1980, he enlisted in the United States Marine Corp Reserves. While serving his country in the Reserves he was also employed for the Newport News Shipyard. In 1983, he relocated back to New York City. In 1984, Bear married his childhood sweetheart Stephanie Greene. His good work ethics continued throughout his employment history. He worked various jobs before accepting a position with the New York Transit Authority in 1986 and remained there for twenty-three years at which time he retired due to injuries sustained from an accident.

Bear had many talents, one of his passions was caring for others. He was a loving husband, father, and provider. His kindness extended far beyond his own family and into the neighborhood. He loved sports especially mentoring and coaching children in the Harlem Little League. He would supervise and walk large groups of children from the neighborhood to their scheduled games. Bears' favorite professional team was the Dallas Cowboys. He welcomed everyone to his home, making sure you were well fed and comfortable. Bear started a "Cookout" tradition that he organized for family and friends to get together every year. He enjoyed having fun, listening to music, cooking, fishing, traveling, and repairing almost anything. Bear was a self-taught Carpenter. He especially loved working on automobiles, his own and everyone else's. Bear is remembered saying "Don't worry, I'll fix it".
