

John L. Lee, 92, of Belmar, passed away Sunday, April 27, 2014. He was born on June 19, 1921 in Dawson, Georgia to Jesse and Estella Smith-Lee. At the age of nine he moved to New Jersey with his mother. He attended HW Mountz Elementary School in Spring Lake, NJ, when the school principal, HW Mountz, himself, was active. John completed the 4th through 6th grades there and he was one of the first African-American students in attendance, at that time. He then attended Belmar Elementary School in Belmar, NJ and graduated from Asbury Park High School in Asbury Park, NJ.

John joined the armed services in 1942 and served with the 469th Aviation Squadron on Guadalcanal and Oahu, Hawaii until being honorably discharged in 1945. He was a WW II veteran. After the service, John opened a dry cleaning business with his cousins in Roselle, NJ.

In 1948 he began employment at Marlboro Psychiatric State Hospital and worked as an attendant. By 1958, John completed nursing school, met and married Colclough Williams (in 1949), and had six children from this union. John continued his education receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology from Monmouth College in 1960.

John was employed for 41 years at Marlboro Hospital working his way up from a hospital attendant to director of nurses and then to associate hospital administrator before retiring in 1989. He also served on the board of directors for the New Jersey State Nurses Association

John was a deacon and a life-long member at Mt. Olive Baptist Church in Lake Como. As a teenager, he was active in church and a civil rights organization arose from a bible youth meeting. Some of the charter members of this organization included individuals such as Donald Tucker, Jimmy Davis, Herbie Johnson, Jesse Scavella, Phillip (Soap) Johnson, Billy K. Reed, Albert Coy, Eddie Minor, and Bert Albouy.

This organization had appearances at the Westside Community Center and on WJLK radio. It unfortunately ended when members began to attend school and gain employment. However, John always recalled another reason for the demise was when the organization began to meet outside the church in efforts to expand its membership.

He served as the president of the Greater Council of Churches in Belmar. John was the publisher and editor of the "Mt. Olive Network" a newsletter that covered church and civic events throughout Monmouth County for almost 20 years. John was a member of the Seacoast Ushers in Monmouth County, John loved the Lord. He loved life, people, animals (especially dogs) and trees. His greatest past-time hobbies were reading, writing, and "talking trash". Many didn't know that John was a great illustrator and poet. He had early desires of creating a comic strip and writing a "best-seller".

John was predeceased by his wife Colclough Capponi Lee in 1994. Surviving are his six children, Terrel Lee, Belmar, NJ, Michael Lee and his wife Laura, Freehold, NJ, Barry Lee and his wife Roslyn, New Rochelle, NY, Debra Lee- Rawlings, Neptune, NJ, Diana Lee, Belmar, NJ, and Valerie Laws and her husband Tyrone Laws, Lake Como, NJ; seven grandchildren, Jason Lee, Asbury Park, NJ, LaDena Rawlings, Eatontown, NJ, Nigel Lee Turner and Noelle Lee Turner, Belmar, NJ, Capponi Lee, New Rochelle, NY, Brianna Lee, Freehold, NJ, and Barry Lee, Jr., New Rochelle, NY; one great-grandson, Jayden Warren "4-Speed", Eatontown; beloved family members, Johnnie Rawlings, Union City, GA, Jeremiah Warren, Eatontown, NJ and many, many cousins and friends.
