Richard Henry Marquis, the oldest of three sons, was born on November 5, 1938 to the late Richard Augustus Marquis and the late Mary Bell (Fillmore) Marquis in Orange, New Jersey.

Richard was joined in Holy Matrimony to Ann Ruth Herring Marquis on August 21, 1976. To this union two daughters were born: Holly and Beate' Marquis. He was a caring husband, father and grandfather.

Richard was employed for over twenty years at Worthington Pump in East Orange, NJ as a mechanist.

Richard was educated in the East Orange Public Schools, attending East Orange High School.

Richard was a talented artist and cartoonist in high school. He was also a fearsome football player and musical drummer. His real love was music. He sang tenor as a member of "the Four Winds" singing group, which was well known throughout New Jersey. His group won 1st place on Ted Macks Amateur Hour. They recorded a record as the "Empires." He also wrote a song in tribute to his late brother, Kenneth Robert Marquis.

Richard later taught himself how to play the guitar and keyboard. **Richard** taught both of his daughters how to play several musical instruments (drums, lead guitar, bass guitar, piano, timbrel). He also taught music to several students in his home.

Richard was an avid chest play and taught his grandsons, Elijah and Jeremy how to play chest at a very young age.

Richard entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, June 25, 2014 at the East Orange General Hospital, East Orange, NJ.
