Obituary

Deacon Ulysses Abrams, known as "Pop" joined the Heavenly Choir on September 8, 2014 from the Chestnut Hill Nursing Home. His journey began on April 23, 1922 in Bibb County, Macon Georgia. He and his brother James were the only two sons born to Jessi and Claude Abrams. On January 5, 1944 in Jeffersonville Georgia he married Elizabeth Slocumb, where this union brought three children: Melvin, Patricia, Sharee and a step son Charles Fred Slocumb.

Deacon Ulysses Abrams received his formal education at BS Ingram Grade School, Macon, Georgia. His spiritual journey started at The First Baptist Church, and later the Mt. Olive Baptist Church under the late Pastor E.S. Evans all in Macon, Georgia.

He excelled in art and loved to draw, but before following this love he decided to serve his country. In 1942, he joined the United States Army. Even though he voluntarily joined the military, Deacon Abrams had to experience segregation by being attached to the 999th Field Artillery Battalion (all Black unit) stationed at Camp Durham, North Carolina. During this tour he was a part of the "D-Day" invasion and was stationed in Germany, France and England. He received an honorable discharge in 1946.


On January 20, 1950, he picked up his love for drawing and enrolled in the Newark School of Fine and Industrial Art. While attending school he accepted employment with the Whippany Paper Company, the Botany Mills Company (9 nine years); the General Manufacturing Company, (25 years), and completed his work experience at the Passaic Board of Education, serving as a custodian of Jefferson School #11 (25 years) until retirement.


Deacon Abrams joined the St. Paul Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Reverend Lucius Walker and was ordained as a Deacon. He truly loved to praise God and truly loved to sing. As a result, Deacon Abrams was moved by the Spirit of God to join the Male Chorus at St. Paul Baptist Church, which was organized by Deacon Prince Carter.


Deacon Prince Carter shared his conversation with Deacon Abrams that the Lord told him to place the leadership skills and office of President to Deacon Ulysses Abrams where he held the position of President from inception until his death. They sung under the musicianship of Louise Odell until her death. Ms. Odell's departure created a serous void in music accompaniment. Taking the lead, Deacon Abrams along with the Male Chorus searched high and low and decided to continue to praise God with no music accompaniment. Under his leadership they joined the Male Chorus Association of New Jersey where he has served as President and Treasurer.


