Life Reflections

Carol Hardy Fudge departed this life on Monday, October 13, 2014. Born on December 19, 1929 in Cranford, New Jersey, she was the third daughter of the late Thomas Hardy and Geneva Hardy Mayers. Carol was educated in the Cranford School System graduating with the Class of 1948.

Carol began her work experience at Western Electric, Kearny, New Jersey. She retired from AT&T with 36 years of service and later worked for the State of New Jersey in the CAP Program (Child Abuse Program) going from school to school teaching young students about child abuse.

At an early age, Carol became a member of St. Mark's AME Church, Cranford, New Jersey where she sang with the Inspirational Choir. In 1992, Carol united with Fountain Baptist Church, Summit and became a faithful member until her health failed. She was a former member of the New Members Committee and Building Fund Board at Fountain Baptist Church. She also worked with the organization Concerned "R" We which provided scholarships for deserving students

and was a Life Member of the NAACP.

Carol married Eugene Fudge on July 17, 1954 and celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary this year.
