

The Obituary

DR. EVANGELAINE FARRIOR STRICKLEN, born May 3, 1928 in Mount Olive, North Carolina, departed this life on Sunday, May 10, 2015 at Newark's University Hospital.

As a result of losing her mother in childbirth and being separated from her father during her formative years, Evangelaine was adopted, raised and loved by Clarence and Annie Farrior. She was nourished and grew, along with her adoptive siblings Annie Pearl and predeceased Elbert and Christine.

Evangelaine's early education began in Mount Olive, North Carolina where she excelled and achieved various awards, including a gold medal in recognition of her talent in speaking. After completing high school at the age of 15, Evangelaine continued her education at St. Augustine College in Raleigh, North Carolina. Desiring to know more about the Lord she attended the reknown Manhattan Bible Institute in New York City, first receiving a Degree of Bachelor of Theology, followed by earning a Masters of Religious Education, and then a Doctorate of Religions Education. All that Evangelaine started, she rose to the top.

Evangelaine's business career encompassed, 29 years of service at the Westinghouse Manufacturing Company. While employed by Westinghouse, she worked as a laborer in the factory, advanced to quality control, and retired as an electrical engineer. For many years she was a member of Westinghouse's Toastmasters International, serving as a treasurer.

In 1946, she met and later married the late Joseph Stricklen. To this union 2 daughters, Lillian and Brenda, and one son, Joseph, were added.


Evangelaine's spiritual journey began as a member of Forbes Riverside Church in New York City. In 1976 she joined Wells Cathedral Church of God In Christ under the leadership of the late Bishop Chandler D. Owens. While a member of Wells Cathedral, Evangelaine served as a missionary, evangelist, usher, Sunday School teacher, and for several years as president of the Home and Foreign Mission. In 1986 she relocated to Phoenix, Arizona and joined Prayer Assembly Church of God in Christ, pastored by Pastor Edward Carter. There she taught Sunday School, worked with the Youth Department, and served as a church mother.

Soon after Dr. Stricklen's move to Phoenix she was led by God to establish an accredited Bible School. She founded the Manhattan Bible Institute/West Inc. at Phoenix (an affiliate of the Manhattan Bible Institute, New York City) and served as Dean and CEO. This Institute operated for 21 years and produced many new pastors, missionaries and teachers. In addition to authoring a book entitled "Jesus The Teacher- Prospectives for Curriculum Planning" (1992).

DR. EVANGELAINE STRICKLEN leaves to mourn her passing: 3 children, Lillian Finney, Brenda McCloud (Alfred) of Phoenix, AZ, Joseph Stricklen of Belleville, NJ, 1 sister, Annie Pearl Jones (Frank) of Philadelphia, PA; 9 grandchildren; 13 greatgrandchildren; 2 cousins, Elgin R. Murray and Clarence Moore; her Prayer Assembly Church family, and a host of friends and loved ones.
