## **Obituary**

Madeleine Pearcy Best was called to be with the Lord on Tuesday, May 19, 2015.

She was the seventh of nine children born to the late William Pearcy and Sarah Hayes Pearcy on January 14, 1917 in Orange, New Jersey. She attended the South Orange-Maplewood Public School System. In 1936, she graduated from Columbia High School.

Four years later, Madeleine married Cornelius Bruce Best. Of this union, two loving sons were born: Bruce and Terrel. Madeleine's sons were her pride and joy. They were special to Madeleine in their own way. *Bruce was a great singer and Terrel a star athlete.* 

While raising a family, Madeleine continued to further her education and work to help support her family. She attended Essex County College, Rutgers and Seton Hall Universities. Madeleine was employed with General Electric for twenty-five years and the East Orange Municipal Court for twenty-three years. Madeline served the City of East Orange with pride and honor. In 1982, Madeleine decided to retire from the East Orange Municipal Court as a Deputy Court Clerk. She stated, that the most exciting experience in her life was her retirement celebration. There were well-wishers far and wide; from California, Boston, Florida, Virginia and even former work friends from General Electric. I was informed that it was the greatest party in the history of Court celebrations.

Madeleine cherished being a member of Fountain Baptist Church and volunteering in the community. She wrote in her memoirs –

My Sunday School Experience was at the top of my Pride and Joy List. Having the opportunity to teach and encourage early-age youngsters to follow our Lord and Savior at home and everywhere. I always reminded them to become law-abiding citizens by obeying the Laws of the Land and encouraging them to share their good fortune with the less fortunate.

I joined Literacy Volunteers of America as a tutor to help inadequate readers to improve their reading skills. This project has been another joy of commitment to serve others and has deeply enhanced my spiritual growth.

I am truly proud and privileged to have played a small part in my Community as a Helper and a Problem Solver whenever or wherever needed to make a difference. Needless to say for my small contribution, I received many awards of thanks and appreciation including Brook Haven Nursing Home that played an important role in coordinating my efforts to help others.

Madeleine was a faithful servant, worldwide traveler, community activist and life-long educator and learner. Madeleine would often say, I lived a good life and have no regrets. Now, I leave my memories for my family and friends to cherish and direct their paths. To God Be the Glory!
