David Leon Olds was born on December 30, 1952 in Kinston, North Carolina to the late Grace Southern-Olds and Richard Olds, Sr. He departed this life on May 18, 2015.

David attended public schools in Jersey City and Orange, New Jersey, graduating from Orange High School. David began his civic duties as a senior in high school serving as a member of the Community Development board in the city of Orange, New Jersey from 1971 - 1974.

In 1974 he pursued a career in the United States Marine Corp receiving an honorable discharge in 1976. He attended Essex County College from 1976 - 1978, earning a Degree in Business Administration. David pursued several positions in management with Rickel's Home Center and World Toyota Chevrolet, from 1984 - 1987.

Although he began his initial career in business pursuits, he discovered his love for working with youth in the Irvington recreation department from 1987 - 1989. In 1990, he began to work with troubled youth as a Youth Counselor at Isaiah House, A Brothers With Brothers Program, from 1990 - 2010.
