Elder Samuel Ulysses Norfleet was born on May 30, 1924 in Gates County, North Carolina, son of the late John and Mary Helen Norfleet. He was one of five brothers and four sisters. His educational journey began in the public school system in Eure, North Carolina.

Elder Norfleet was a Bus Attendant for Barker Bus Company, retiring in September 2014 after becoming ill. Previously, he was gainfully employed as a Machinist at Exxon Research in Linden, New Jersey for many years.

Elder Norfleet met and married Lunettie Ingram and was blessed with two daughters and a stepson from a previous marriage.

Elder Norfleet joined the Supreme Council of the House of Jacob in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1950. He moved to Brooklyn, New York and later to Edison, New Jersey. Elder Norfleet was a member for 65 years. Elder Norfleet loved to play the harmonica, guitar and cymbals. He was a willing worker for the church. His motto was "whatsoever your hands find to do, do it with a whole heart."

With an effervescent aura that would light up the whole room, Elder Norfleet never failed at putting a smile on other peoples' faces. To label him a "hard worker" would be an understatement; he worked from the young age of 8 up to the age of 90.

On Monday, May 25, 2015, Elder Norfleet departed this life peacefully at JFK Hospital in Edison surrounded by his family at the age of ninety.

He was predeceased by his wife, Mother Lunettie Norfleet; daughter, Shiryl Watson; son-in-law, John Wiggins, Jr.; brothers: Vernon Norfleet, George Norfleet, and Thomas Norfleet; sisters, Bridie Fletcher, Beulah Wilson, Gladis Harrison and Vennie Norfleet.
