Dorothy Ellen Collins was born May 10, 1961 in Elizabeth, New Jersey. She was the daughter of the late Dolores V. Collins and Lawrence C. Collins, and granddaughter of the late Mildred King of Roselle, NJ.

Dotty attended Roselle Public Schools and graduated from Abraham Clark High School in 1979. Following high school, she attended Seton Hall University. Dot worked as a Claims Examiner for NJ Manufacturers Insurance and Prudential Insurance companies. She later became a Claims Supervisor at Material Damage Adjusters in Edison, NJ and an Administrative Coordinator for Granison Productions, Inc. (GPI) in Roselle, NJ. Most recently, she worked in education in Roselle Public Schools and ended her career in the Linden Public School System after becoming ill. Dot also worked on the Board of Elections at the polls, was a member of the National Council of Negro Women-Roselle branch, and a past member of the National Association of Business and Professional Women's Clubs. Dotty received Christ as her Personal Savior at an early age and was baptized at Shiloh Baptist Church, Elizabeth, NJ.

Dot was a very social person and enjoyed spending time with her friends and family. She also liked to use her creativity in making custom baskets and gifts. She loved music, modeling, movies, and anything that created a fun and festive atmosphere.

On May 29, 2015 after a brief illness, Dorothy departed her earthly home at the age of 54 and was happily reunited with her mother and grandmother in heaven.
