## Obituary

**Deacon Lloyd R. Freckleton** was born on March 13, 1939, in Barton St. Catherine, Jamaica, WI; to Arnel Freckleton and the late Viola Bryan. He was christened at St. Catherine Methodist Church and educated in the Barton St. Catherine school system.

Lloyd migrated to the United States in 1965 where he held numerous jobs, Lead Spot Welder for Aerospace Manufacturing in Connecticut, Field Forman for T. West Fruit Company in Orlando, Florida and Supervisor for a General Electric plant in Massachusetts.

On October 15, 1971, he became a U.S. citizen and a graduate of the New England Tractor Trailer School in Quincy, Mass. He worked as a long distance driver for over fourteen years, hauling for such well-known companies as Branch Motor Express, Kroblin Refrigerated and Mirrors Trucking. In 1985, he gave up long distance driving and started local and tri-state runs for Paul's Trucking Company in Avenel, NJ. He continued this job, hauling for Pathmark Stores until 1992.

In 2004, Lloyd passionately gave his life to Christ and was baptized by Pastor James W. Ealey at Second Baptist Church of Rahway, NJ. He was a very active member who lovingly and diligently worked for Christ in service to others. Aside from being a faithful deacon, he sang with the Male Chorus, was Vice President of the Men's Fellowship, was chosen 2010 Man of the Year, successfully completed first and second Kerygma classes and he often prepared tasty Caribbean and soulful meals at various church functions. He was well known for "Deacon Freckleton's famous oxtails" and rice and beans.

Deacon Lloyd was a well-loved, gentle giant with a heart so big and so full of love that it overflowed to everyone he met.

He was predeceased by his son, Omar Garner.

He now leaves to cherish his memories: his wife, Ruth, of twenty-three years; four sons, Winston Freckleton (Deborah), Khy Garner, Hakeem Garner (Gwenetta), Abdul Garner (Annita); two daughters, Mureen Aird (Alfred) and Nadine Freckleton; a niece/daughter, Kartika McLamb. "Pop pop's" memory will be cherished by: grandsons, Joshua, Ty, Ajani, James, Malcolm, Sha'tear, Omari, Eric and Aaron; and by precious granddaughters, Tremaine, Annisa and Jaynna; his sisters, Ruby Mills of Canada and Veronica Williams of Corona, NY; and his brothers, Owen Allen of Rahway NJ, and Clyde Baker; along with a host of nieces, nephews, other family members and a loving church family will cherish his memories.
