On Friday, June 5, 2015, Mrs. Doris Elizabeth Crawford quietly and serenely slept away at home, surrounded by family and loved ones. She took wings and flew to her celestial home.

Mrs. Crawford was the First Lady of the Beulah Baptist Church located at 580 South Twelfth Street in Newark, New Jersey. She was an only child, born to the late Marinda and Eugene Tuggle on February 7, 1929 in Atlanta, Georgia. She began her Christian walk at the Woodward Baptist Church in Atlanta, under the leadership of Rev. K. Bland.

At a young age, she met and married the late Charles L. Wallace. From that union three children were born, James Lewis (Puddin), Claude Leon (Lee) and Doris Anita (Nita).

It was in 1947 that Doris accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as her personal Savior and surrendered her plans of an earthly life to follow the plans of "The Planner of Everlasting Life."

In 1953 her mother, Marinda Tuggle relocated the family to Newark, New Jersey and shortly thereafter, the family joined the Beulah Baptist Church under the leadership of the Late Rev. J. C. Crawford and she remained a faithful servant and member for 62 years.

In 1962 she was united in holy matrimony to Rev. Crawford. As a young pastor of Beulah for only 13 years, they became one mind in Christ, committed to serve and to lead the people and the church as God would have them. In supporting her husband, many ministries were organized. The Nurse's Unit and the Juniorette Choir were just a few ministries that she loved and labored to see that they took root to flourish. Doris sang in the Senior Choir, held the position of President of the Nurse's Unit, and worked diligently as the church decorator, Vacation Bible School Director, the Pastor's Secretary, and wherever else there was a need. She served to the best of her ability. Of all the ministries she served, her love was teaching Sunday school. Mrs. Crawford was a "Called Teacher" of the Word. Gifted, anointed and favored by God. She would present the lesson like no other, making it plain, so everyone could understand the Word of God. Doris Crawford fed the hungry, clothed the naked and counseled many people. Hold on to God's unchanging hand and pray, was a favorite saying. Pray and keep on Praying. She touched so many lives, and so many lives were changed because of the prayers she prayed for them. Throughout New Jersey, New York and the Baltimore, MD area, she was often the guest speaker for Women's Day at numerous churches and events.

In addition to her church activities, this first lady was involved in the activities of the Ministers' Wives Associations. Sister Doris Crawford was a member of the International Association of Ministers' Wives and Ministers' Widows, Incorporated; The New Jersey Association of Ministers' Wives and Ministers'; She participated in the local organization of the Ministers Wives & Widows Alliance of Jersey City/Newark and Vicinity until she transferred her membership to the Abatenjwa Alliance of Ministers' Wives and Ministers' Widows of Newark and Vicinity. She was a faithful and active member in Abatenjwa and held the position as chaplain. She delighted in traveling and attending the conventions of the Ministers' Wives and Ministers' Widows Associations. The sisters in these organizations were dear to her heart.

In November, 1971, Mrs. Crawford received a Diploma in Professional Custom Millinery from the Academy of Millinery Design, Little Falls, New Jersey. She loved to custom design her hats and to coordinate them with her "First Lady" ensembles. She loved to decorate her home and to make it beautiful for her family. She loved to shop for clothes, shoes and jewelry. Her favorite color was emerald green and her favorite flower was the orchid. Her favorite scripture was the 51st Division of Psalms, her favorite song was "He Touched Me" and her favorite metered hymn was "Father I Stretched My Hands To Thee".

Whether she is called My, Ma, Mama, Grandma, GG, Aunt Doris, Sister Crawford, Mother Crawford or just Mother, she will be greatly missed. Mama loved her family and all the children. She loved the family gatherings at her house; the 4th of July cook-outs; Thanksgiving dinners; and of course Christmas with all the kids, gifts and laughter. Mama spoke often and shared memories about her late husband, Rev. J.C. Crawford. She was a faithful and loyal wife for 27 years.... And now they are reunited in heaven. Mourning her are her children, James, Claude and Nita, her grandchildren, James Wallace Jr. (Linda); Sinclair Wallace (Keisha); Monique Coston; Kaietha Andrews (Alex); Claude Wallace Jr.; and Regina Wallace; a God Daughter; Ethel Jackson, of Orlando, FL; a God Son, Rev. Douglas Williams III; 12 Great-Grandchildren; 6 Great-Great Grandchildren; The McDowell Family; two cousins, Annie Mae Gates and Runetta Bowden of Atlanta, GA; her Beulah Family; and a host of many friends and love ones.


