Reflections of Life

Dr. Olisha "Jean" McKenzie, daughter of the Late John Henry "Bud" McKenzie and Adaree McKenzie, was born on September 14, 1960, in Florence County, South Carolina. Dr. O and her family moved to Paterson, New Jersey, soon after her birth. Dr. O grew up in Paterson and was educated through the Paterson Public School system where she was a drum majorette and the captain of the majorettes during her high school years. She graduated from John F. Kennedy High School in 1978.

Dr. O (as she was lovingly called throughout the UHCA, Inc.) was a lifelong member of the UHCA (United Holy Church of America, Inc.) and was a faithful and devoted member of her home church, Creech Temple UHCA in Paterson, NJ under the leadership of the late Dr. James C. Creech and New Creech Temple's current pastor, Dr. Moses Lee McKenzie, Sr. She accepted Christ as her personal Savior at an early age and worked faithfully in the UHCA on the local, sub-district and district levels. She furthered her education by receiving her Bachelor's degree in Religious Education from Manhattan Bible Institute, her Master's degree in Theology from United Christian College and Bible Institute of the UHCA, Inc., and her Ph.D. in Sacred Theology from Alpha Bible Institute of Nutley, New Jersey. She earned these degrees alongside her Special Uncle and Pastor, Dr. Moses L. McKenzie Sr. He served as one of her confidants and friends while they encouraged one another to keep pressing forward as they continued their education. Through the years, Dr. O held many positions in the UHCA, in her local church, on the sub-district level and on the district level. Among them she served as Assistant Financial Secretary, Praise and Worship Leader, Graphic Designer for church advertisements and programs; she served as the Executive Assistant to the Board of District Elders of the Northern-New Jersey Sub-District UHCA, Inc. and was the Administration's Corresponding Secretary for 5 years. She served on the District Level with the Memorial Service Committee of the Greater Northern District UHCA, Inc. Dr. Olisha Jean McKenzie also served as the Dean of Students and as an Instructor at the New Creech Temple extension of The United Christian College and Bible Institute of the UHCA, Inc.

"Jean", as she was lovingly called by her family, lived an exemplary life. She was an encourager to family, friends, her students and anyone she came into contact with to get to know the Lord and to accept HIM as their personal Savior. She would always encourage everyone to "Study to Show Themselves Approved unto God". She was gentle, soft spoken, shy, and a gracious woman of God. She rendered her initial sermon at New Creech Temple on November 23, 2014, elevating her, in God, to serve as Minister Dr. Olisha Jean McKenzie. She officially ministered for the first time on a sub-district level (North NJ Sub-District of the UHCA) during the Holy week services on Good Friday April 3, 2015.

Professionally, Jean was employed by Prudential, Passaic County Community College, and William Paterson University. She most recently worked at the College of Nursing at Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey, where she worked faithfully for nearly 30 years. More notably, she served as Chief Executive Officer, SecServe Enterprises, her own company, where she utilized her graphic design skills to the fullest.

Jean was a perfectionist and believed in doing everything with decency and order. Her gifts and talents were numerous. To many, Jean was always a DIVA, in the best sense of the word. She was also a seamstress, a graphic designer, interior designer, and singer who sung every song just like the artist who recorded it. She often led songs with the Gospel Crusaders Choir of New Creech Temple and the Praise and Worship Team where her gift would lead many into worship.

Jean was a family woman who loved spending time with her son, Isaiah, whom she loved dearly, and her baby sister, Shewanda. Family gatherings were always special to her and she enjoyed the company and laughter that was shared with her loving mother, Adaree, her aunts, uncles, cousins and special friends. In her free time, Jean could be found studying The Word as she read her Bible, or reading some of her other favorite books -The Power of a Praying Wife, The Power of a Praying Woman or Martha Stewart's Diet Detox. Some of her favorite shows could be found on HGTV or the Hallmark Channel where she could watch episodes of one her favorite shows, "I Love Lucy."

Jean was preceded in death by her daughter, Arielle Brinson; her father, John Henry "Bud" McKenzie; her maternal grandparents, James and Pearl Williams; her paternal grandparents, Leroy and Cora McKenzie; her aunts, Hattie Zimmerman, Reedell Lewis, Teletha Horne and Beronzy McKenzie; her uncles, James Williams, Jr., Willie Williams, and David McKenzie; her niece, Imani D. Poindexter; and her godson, Daeshawn Bryant.

Jean answered God's call home on Sunday, June 7, 2015, in Paterson.

There are some things, though, she would want everyone to know that can be found in some of her favorite scriptures: I Corinthians 2:9 - But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him.
