"Taxi! Taxi! Where do you want to go sir?

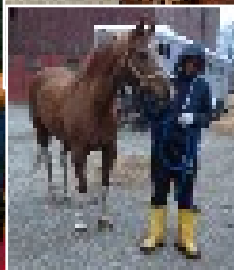
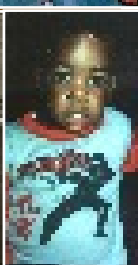
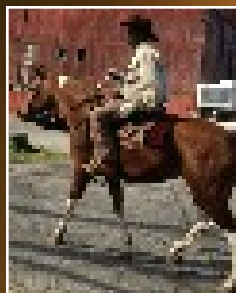
