She was a trustee of the Tau Omega charitable Trust Fund, Incorporated, which is the philanthropic organization that receives Tau Omega's charitable contributions and funds scholarship and community service programs.

Mentor for many, she believed in education, sacrifice and management of resources to become and remain self-supporting. If you spent any time in her company you would soon realize that she had a wealth of knowledge. Cynthia was always willing to help a worthy cause. Cynthia voiced her opinion and fought for what she believed in.
