Reflections of Life

Henry W. Harmon "Hank" was born on September 1, 1924 in Scullville, Atlantic County, New Jersey. He was the third child of Laura Jane (Bond) and David Wesley Harmon. He moved with his family to Passaic at an early age.

Henry was educated in the Passaic school system. He served in the U.S. Navy during WW II as a Seaman First Class, in the South Pacific and was honorably discharged on December 7, 1945.

As a youth, Henry shined shoes and at sixteen years old delivered medications on his bike for Briggins Drug Store. Henry was a graduate of Newark School of Auto Body Repair in May of 1952. For many years, he worked for Post & Baker – painting, lettering and repairing cars and trucks, Clifton, NJ; part time at the Clifton Dog & Cat Hospital and U.S. Mail Truck Driver for Ray Laffler, Clifton until retirement.

Henry's hobbies included his Harley Davidson motorcycle; dog training and health care and car detailing.

He was predeceased by his two sisters, Ella Mae Harmon Taylor and Elizabeth Bond Smith.

Henry W. Harmon, 90, departed this life on Sunday, June 14, 2015.

Henry leaves to cherish his memory: his sister, Helen (Harmon) Allen of Passaic; nephews, Martin of Irvington and Steven (Judith) Allen of Delran; niece, Donna (Stephen) Allen of Tinton Falls; a host of cousins, great-nieces and nephews, other relatives and friends.
