

<u>Obituary</u>

Amelia Forrest, affectionately called "**Aunt Melia**" was born on the 24th of March 1923 at 124 Constant Spring Rd. in Saint Andrew, Jamaica. She was the eighth child of twelve born to Michael and Bresita Forrest of St. Andrew and very importantly one of three sets of twins although losing her partner very early in life.

She attended the Swallowfield Elementary School and thereafter the Shortwood Practicing School where she was like her other siblings an excellent performer of real penmanship. Her social and community activities included being an outstanding member of the Shortwood Congregational and United Church where for many years she was a member of the Senior Choir and the Women's Fellowship. During her later years, she became a devoted member of The Young Women Christian Association (Y.W.C.A.) and engaged herself in several outreach and social activities so as to promote help for especially young adolescent females.

In 1953, she went to Bermuda and was employed to Lawyer/Barister Richards who later became a Legislator before becoming the Premier of Bermuda. From 1964 to 1984, she worked in the Main Laundry of the University of the West Indies from being a regular employee until rising to become a supervisor.

In 1984, she migrated to the United States of America (U.S.A.) where another chapter of her illustrious life commenced. Here she continued to engage herself in social activities not least among which was her devotion in her church at the Calvary Rooseville United Methodist Church in East Orange, New Jersey, where one of her duties and stewardship was the meeting and greeting of all members, congregants and visitors to church in a warm and friendly manner which she did unflinchingly and admirably up to the time of her grave illness and later death. Her devotion, zeal, faithfulness and love for all the lives she touched whether directly or indirectly will never be forgotten.

She leaves to mourn her irreparable loss: (sister), Iona; (brother), Wilfred; (son), Trevor; (daughter), Verna; (daughter-in-law), Delores; (grandchildren), Chris, Stephen, Kerry-Ann and Stephanie; seven great-grandchildren, several nieces, nephews and a host of relatives and friends from all walks of life.
