Theresa was preceded in death by her mother, Lillian Mae Caver, brother, Alfred L. Caver Jr., and sister, Walita Ann Caver.

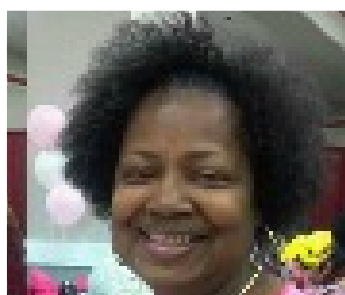
