

Obituary

Born on April 18, 1919, **Adrian Adolphus Shaw**, also known as "Dad" made his grand appearance at St. Elizabeth, Jamaica. Dad was a man of integrity and was family oriented. He leaves the legacy of commitment and the importance of family and relationships. He married Lauretta Shaw on April 18, 1954 and fathered his four children Carl, Trevor, Yvonne and Ann-Marie. Up until his passing, Dad shared an amicable relationship with his wife and will most be remembered for his favorite quote "pain in my back side" whenever one asks him, How are you doing?

Dad's career began as a Fisherman in Jamaica. So skilled at what he did, he received the opportunity to expand his fishing career in Guantanamo Bay, Cuba until September 7, 1983 when he, his beloved wife Lauretta, and Ann-Marie migrated to the United States. Although, Dad did not continue with his fishing career, he continued to work diligently to maintain his family as a Factory worker.

On June 17, 2015, Dad was called back to his maker at the age of 96. As we all mourn his death, he left behind memorable moments we will all cherish. Dad is survived by his wife Lauretta Shaw and four children Trevor, Yvonne, Ann-Marie and Carl. Dad is also survived by much loved grandchildren, great grandchildren, nieces, nephews, relatives, and close friends.
