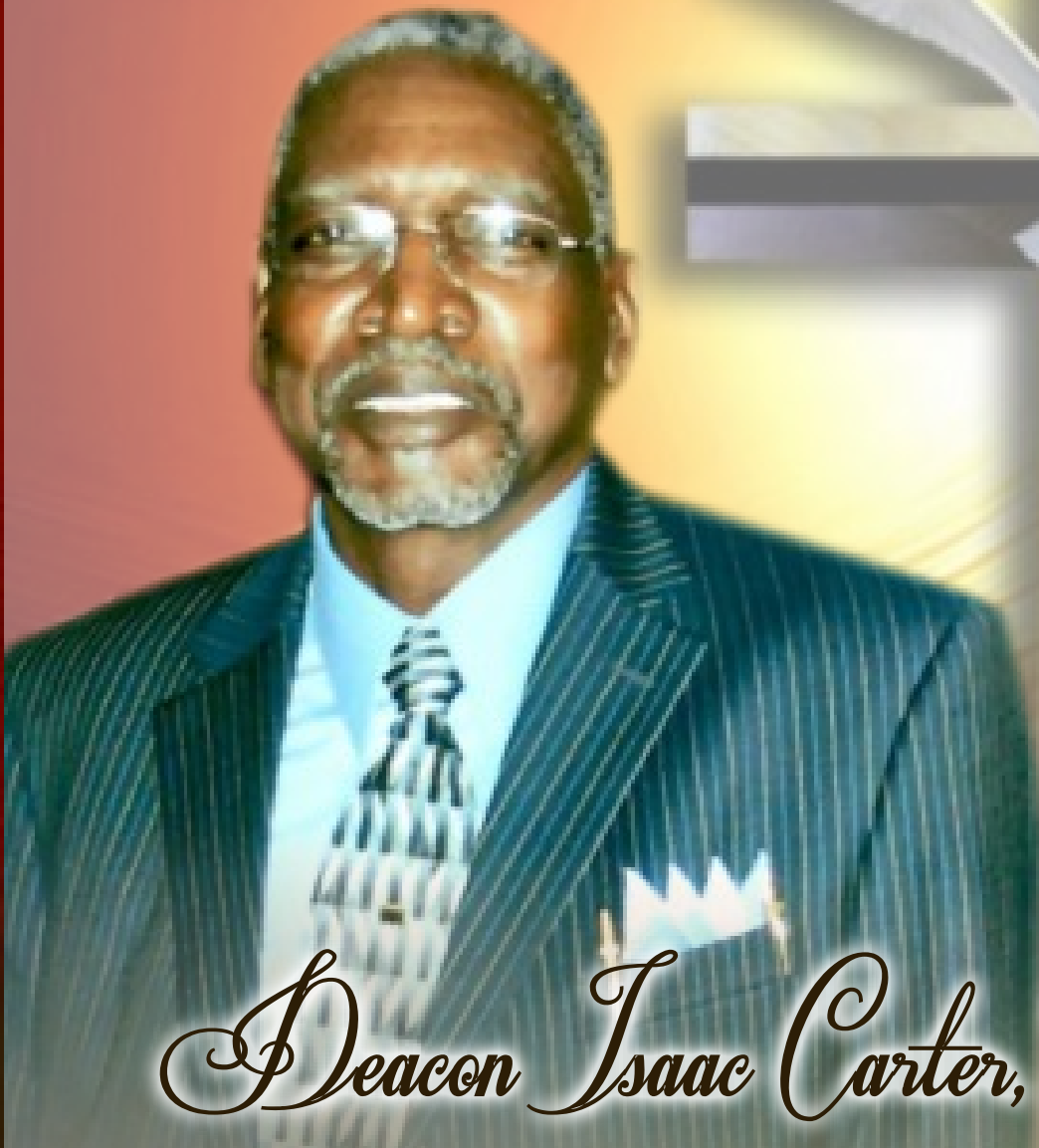

It's lonesome here without you

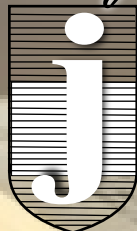
We miss you so each day,
