### Reflections of Life

Carrie Bell (Anthony) Jackson, the youngest child of Aldo and Mary (Eveleigh) Anthony, was born in Liberty Hill, South Carolina on June 8, 1926.

Carrie met and later married, John M. Jackson, a WWII Army veteran, on November 26, 1949. They remained married until John's sudden and untimely death in September, 1977. Carrie and John migrated from South Carolina to New Jersey, circa 1954. Together they had five children, Marvin Lee, Ada Novella, Aleshia, Christine Mary and John Alfred.

Carrie worked as a domestic before illness forced her to stop working. She was a quiet, soft-spoken woman, who loved her family and had a knack for cooking. She made simple, southern meals that included basic ingredients, but were big on taste. Homemade biscuits and pies were a specialty.

Carrie was a loyal and faithful member of Jehovah's Witnesses, attending the Kingdom Hall on Trenton Avenue, in Paterson. She could often be seen standing out by the old Pathmark and other locations around the city, offering the Awake! and Watchtower magazines to all who were willing to receive them.

At the time of her death, Carrie was a resident of St. Vincent's Nursing Home in Cedar Grove, NJ. She passed away quietly in her sleep on July 10, 2015, at the age of eighty-nine.

She was preceded in death by her husband, John, son, John "Chip" and grandson, Shawn. She was also preceded in death by her four siblings, sister, Toro Bell and brothers, Ceals "Sonny Boy", Earnest and Clifford.
