Reflections of Life

Kalvin Lashon Newborn was born on January 6, 1995 to Lisa Newborn and Kelvin Hunter. He spent most of his childhood in Newark, NJ until he relocated to Charlotte, North Carolina. While growing up in Newark, Calvin attended Madison Avenue grade school until 6th grade. After relocating to Charlotte, NC Calvin aka "Bear" was enrolled at Albemarle Road Middle School until graduating and attending Harding University High School. Bear went on to graduate from Harding University but not before securing his title of "national honor society" recipient. He also ranked "top 5" in his graduating class.

After leaving high school, Bear continued his education on an academic scholarship at Pittsburgh University majoring in Pharmaceutical with a minor in Engineering. During his stay in Pittsburgh, he worked as a Pharmaceutical Technician along with other odd jobs. When not at work or school, Bear was very competitive in the sports arena. He played tennis, soccer, football and ran track. Until he later found his true passion was in helping others. Bear began to endeavor on a humanitarian quest to reach out to those less fortunate than he. Bear joined "Missions" volunteer organization in 2012, which allowed him the opportunity to travel to Dominican Republic to help build schools for orphaned children.

Bear was fearless and always embarked on new adventures, sought out new challenges, and set the bar high for himself. He was a leader amongst his peers, spoke gently with much wisdom while always providing a message of hope, acceptance and equality. Although Bear departed from his life on July 10, 2015, his legacy will never be forgotten.
