Henry George also known as “**Bay Bruh**” was born on April 9, 1945 in Birmingham, Alabama, son of Mary Jane McGinnis George and Willie Isaac George. He was educated in the Birmingham, Alabama Public School System and graduated from R. B Hudson High School in Selma, AL in 1965.

Henry had been employed as a Supervisor for Colony Furniture Company in Linden, New Jersey, was a Selector for Supermarket General in Elizabeth, New Jersey, was a Security Officer for Nielsen Detective Agency in Elizabeth, NJ, was a Delivery Man for Tops Appliance Store in Edison, New Jersey and retired after many years as an Assembler for Simmons Mattress Company in Piscataway, New Jersey.

He was an avid fan of the New York Jets football team, New York Mets baseball team and New York Knicks basketball team. He was a former member of Liberty Baptist Church in Elizabeth, NJ.
