Reflections of Life

Willie James Irby, son of the late Wilburt and Helen Irby, was born in Spartanburg, South Carolina on April 22, 1931, the eldest of nine siblings. Willie was educated in the Spartanburg school system, and in 1952, enlisted in the U.S. military where he rose in rank to Corporal. Following his honorable discharge from the military, he traveled to Kansas City, MO and later relocated to Jersey City, NJ where he lived until the end of 2013. In 2013, he was moved to New Vista Nursing Facility in Newark, NJ where he resided until his untimely demise on July 27, 2015. During his career, he was employed by the Jersey City, ASPCA, and it was there he earned the nickname "Dog Catcher". In 1973, Willie became employed by Jersey Mill Works where he worked until he retired in 2000. Not many people know Willie was an athlete and that he played baseball for the Jersey City Cardinals.

Willie was a family man. A devoted husband, loving father, and loyal friend. He also had an excellent work ethic. He had an amazing sense of humor and was very giving. Most importantly, he was a God fearing man. One of his pastimes was to sit on his porch and speak with his neighbors and citizens in his community. Willie met the woman who was to become his wife in the early 1960's, and in 1980, he married his second and loving wife, Betty Louise Irby (nee Weston), and to this union a daughter, Lisa, was born.
