Obituary

Life ceased in peace for Albert Gaston McLeod, in the early afternoon hours of August 15, 2015 at his home in Newark, NJ. "Grandad" as he was affectionately known to his family and friends was born in Troy, Alabama on September 12, 1929. He was the second eldest of seven children born to Julius Gaston and Lottie Bay McLeod. His parents, wife Fannie Mae, son Albert "Sonny boy" Gaston Jr., daughter Patricia Ann, son-in-law Abner Fields and four siblings Robert, John, Victor and Mittie Jean preceded him in death. Albert received his primary education in Troy, Alabama's Public School system (Academy Street High School 1946). Albert found employment as an Assembly Man with Ford Motor Company July 23, 1956 (When the Ford Plant closed in Mahwah, NJ. Al transferred to Kansas City, MO) where he retired July 1, 1986. Al was a long time member (30 years) of UAW United Auto Workers of America.

Al was united in marriage to Fannie Mae Britt (Smith) on December 24, 1945. To this union six children were born.

Al loved gardening. His well-manicured lawns and planted flowers were his pride and joy. People would stop and ask him what he used to make his grass so green. He spent hours trimming the grass like he was giving it a precision haircut.
