Once married, the couple returned to Elizabeth, New Jersey and was blessed with five children.

Lee retired as a Forklift Operator for Rocket Distribution Industries in Linden after ten years of service. Previously, he worked as a Forklift Operator at Elizabeth Rubber Waste Company in Elizabeth for 35 years.
