Obituary

Marjorie Sylvia Ince was born in Barbados on October 1, 1922 to the union of Fitz Gollop and Emmy Rawlins. She became an orphan at an early age after losing both her parents to accidents. She was raised by her grandmother, Catherine Culpepper. In 1949, she was joined in holy matrimony to Gordon Ince.

Marjorie spent her formative years working in Barbados and in spite of the difficult times she had to endure, she vowed that she would not lose her children to the streets. She was a disciplinarian. She taught them the importance of a good spiritual foundation, moral character and a solid education. As such, play was always secondary to church and school.


While in Barbados, Marjorie was a member of the Foursquare Church of the Nazarene. In 1985, after migrating to the United States, she joined St. James AME Church. She enjoyed having her family and friends around her and would always find ways to make them laugh. She loved and nurtured her family and had a major influence on all her grand and great grandchildren, as well as her many friends.

Marjorie loved the Lord, loved to sing and recite scripture. She was blessed with a good memory, and after losing her sight, she would spend many days and nights reciting scripture and singing songs; and like David she would just encourage herself in the Lord. During her illness, one could hear her singing some of her favorite songs: "I Am Delivered Praise The Lord", "When We All Get To Heaven", "I'll Fly Away"; and reciting her favorite scriptures: Psalms 1, 23, and The Lord's Prayer.

She was preceded in death by her daughter, Jennifer Ince (1955), son, Turian Rawlins (2006), husband, Gordon Ince (2011), and adopted daughter, Nola Agard (2013).

She was outgoing and possessed a loving spirit. She leaves to mourn: three loving children, Rev. Garvey Ince (Mary), Pamela Ince-Taylor (Leon), and Aileen Ince; five grandchildren, Sheldon (Kerryann), Steven (Kelly), Nicole, Camille (Keith), and Janelle; six great grandchildren, Marquise, Makayla, Tisean, Skyler, Michelle, and Zara.

She will be sorely missed by all her children, relatives, caretakers and many friends.
