Reflections of Life

Millicent Yvonne (McCormick) Mathis, was born on May 31, 1943, in Passaic, NJ. She was the first child of the late James & Millicent McCormick. Affectionately known as "Yvonne". She matriculated through the Passaic School system and graduated in 1961. She then went on to attend Sawyer Business School, the American Institute of Banking in Clifton, NJ and then later attended Royal Business School in NY.

In August of 1964, Yvonne landed a position as a student loan supervisor at Broadway Bank & Trust Company in Paterson, NJ. She received several promotions within the company before joining Caribe International in NYC, where she worked as an Assistant to the President. In early 1976, she moved on to Berg Chemical Company, Bronx. In 1981, Yvonne, took a leap of faith and started her own company, Priority Chemical Company, along with her business partner, Ed Lindsey. Priority Chemical Company successfully partnered with various companies providing distribution maintenance chemical and cleaning compounds. The company was featured in Black Enterprise Magazine and they received a number of achievement awards for entrepreneurial success.

Yvonne, met and married the love of her life CL Mathis on July 23, 1966. They remained married for 44 years until his passing in October of 2010. In 1985, Yvonne and CL Mathis, became the proud parents of Eagle Lester and Elizabeth Edna Lynn Mathis. She was a loving and supportive mother who always provided and wanted the best for her children.

From childhood, Yvonne was an active member of The Bethel A.M.E Church, Passaic. She served in multiple leadership positions including the Usher Board, the Trustee Board, the Steward Board and the Finance Committee.

Yvonne, retired at the age of 62 in 2005, at which time she took a part-time position as an Administrative Asst. at

Wayne Ford in Wayne, NJ. In 2012, Yvonne moved to Willingboro, NJ to live with her beloved sister, Betty McKinnon, the two shared a close bond. They enjoyed IHOP breakfast dates, often having to convince the wait staff that they both were eligible for the senior discount. Yvonne also enjoyed bargain shopping on Passaic's Main Avenue as well as watching her favorite television shows The Have & Have Nots, Undercover Boss, westerns, game shows and the crazy guests on the Dr. Phil show. She also developed a strong bond with Yvette Jackson, who became Yvonne's primary daily caretaker in 2012 and graciously offered not only daily companionship but exceptional care. When Yvonne wasn't walking or watching her favorite shows, she was often caught sneaking Marshall, Betty's dog (although he claimed Yvonne) table food as a way of buying his canine lovalty.

On Friday, September 25, 2015, Yvonne Mathis' Savior saw fit to call her home for her reward.

Yvonne was preceded in death by her husband, CL Mathis of Clifton, NJ and her parents, James & Millicent McCormick of Clifton, NJ.
