Annie Justeen Kelly was born December 18, 1941, in Louisburg, North Carolina, to the late James Napoleon Kelly and Mary Virginia Davis Kelly. Lovingly known as "Teen" to the family, she departed this life on October 2, 2015 at Newark Beth Israel Medical Center. She was preceded in death by her three brothers, James, Shelly and Claude Kelly.

She graduated in 1959 from Franklin County Training School in Louisburg, North Carolina. To further her education, she relocated to New Jersey and attended Essex County College in Essex County, New Jersey and graduated with an Associate degree. Following her desire to be in the medical field, she attended New Jersey City University and graduated with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing. For over 20 plus years, she worked at the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey (UMDNJ) now known as Rutgers School of Biomedical and Health Sciences until she retired.
