

Louis Mack Jr. was born on April 21, 1942 in Florence, South Carolina to Daisy and Louis Mack, Sr. He was the first of eight children. His brothers Leon and Clyde Mack preceded him in death.

He received his formal education in the New York City public school system. He attended Samuel Gompers High School. Louis went on to join the United States Army and served four tours in the Vietnam War. He received his Master's Degree in Engineering while in service in the U.S Army. He achieved several honors and medals while employed with the government. He received a Korean Civilian Service Medal for his tour of duty, a Purple Heart for his tour in Vietnam and he attained the rank of E-7 Sergeant First class.

Louis dedicated fifty-four years of his life working for the United States Government. He worked in different capacities of the United States Military for twenty- five years before he went on to work for the United States Department of Defense, until his retirement last year.

Louis traveled the world. He was an avid reader who was very passionate about education, world history and politics. He loved going to church and reading his bible. He loved working on his antic car, and retelling old war stories to his family and friends. Louis was a dedicated husband, loving father, outstanding brother and uncle, and a devoted friend.

Louis was called home on October 14, 2015. He leaves to mourn his wife Dereen Mack, sons LaRon and Delano Mack; brother, Vernon Mack; four sisters, Dorothy Johnson, Mae Mack, Angela Mack and Eloise Gary; nieces Crystal Mack and Regine Gary; nephews Melvin Johnson, Timothy and Reginald Mack; one brother-in law Michael Gary ; a devoted companion Judith Maturah; and a host of relatives and friends.
