The Obituary

Her diligence was rewarded, as she was bestowed with the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Award. On life's winding road, she was well-equipped with fortitude and steadfastness; for in 1995, the Lord called her husband home, after forty-five years of marriage. Whether it was for family or her church, Praise Temple Church of God, and the connections with other congregations, she has "Well Done, Thou Good Faithful Servant".
