Annie Ruth Underwood was born on February 22, 1928 in Marion, Perry County, Alabama to the late Martha Alice McCarroll and Jimmie Warren. After a long illness she departed this life on October 31, 2015.

Throughout her journey in life, it was Annie's to offer love. Affectionately known as Ruth, and aware of her destiny, in 1940 she moved to Birmingham, Alabama to pursue work so she could contribute to the family's finances in those difficult economic times. During the Civil Rights Era, she exhibited her love for the community by attending rallies, providing food, and opening up her home as shelter for the Freedom Fighters. In 1968, she relocated to Passaic, NJ to be with her beloved brothers, and to explore more opportunities. Upon her arrival in Passaic, she continued to extend a helping hand to anyone in need, always ending her good-byes with "I Love You."

She was employed by Becton-Dickson for more than 20 years. She was also employed by the Hamilton Plaza Nursing Home Passaic and the Beth Israel Hospital Passaic as a Home Health Aide.

Her faith in God was reinforced when she became a member of the Bethel A.M.E. Church Passaic, where she diligently served as a member of the Culinary Auxiliary, and laundered the linen for the Altar area

She was preceded in death by her beloved son, Alfred Underwood; her parents, Martha Alice McCarroll and Jimmie Warren; two brothers, Alfred McCarroll and Paul McCarroll; and a grandson, Quenzelle Mickle.
