Dulcie started her career as a school teacher at Supply Government School and subsequently became a public servant. In this capacity, she served various Government Departments over the years. She later joined the Guyana Airways Corporation and served for several years before migrating.

In 1982, Dulcie migrated to the United States to begin a new chapter in her life. She realized that leaving her relatives to start this new phase would be a major adjustment, but also recognized that she could take advantage of the opportunity to pursue her dreams. She started to work and attend classes to equip herself with the skills required to become her best self.

Dulcie worked for Continental Insurance Company and American International Group, Inc. (AIG) for over thirty years combined. She was later employed with Barclays Center as one of their first employees in 2012 until her illness.

She enjoyed all she did and was very determined to share her blessings and accomplishments with her loved ones. This was evident in the way anyone could call upon her at anytime and be sure to have a tasty meal and place to stay. Her home was seen to everyone as 'Headquarters'. It was a place where no one could possibly have an empty stomach (except when they were on a fast).

Dulcie had many hobbies such as reading and traveling but most of all enjoyed cooking and baking. She knew what everyone's favorite dish was and always made sure it was prepared when they visited. She will be greatly missed for all she did. Celebration of holidays, birthdays and special occasions will not be the same because of the void that her passing has created. She was the driving force behind all family events and will greatly be missed. Our hearts are overflowing with gratitude for the part she played to ensure that our lives were made richer because of hers. For that, we say 'Thank You'. To God Almighty we give Thanks and Praise and Glory and Honor!

Dulcie was a God-fearing woman who knew the Lord. While she was hospitalized and was visited by her nephew, Khalil Amsterdam, she told him that God has a plan for her and she would be okay. God saw she was getting weary and took her in His arms.
