Reflections of Life

Frances (Staton) Walls Ladson born November 10, 1915 in Gibson, North Carolina to the



late Frank and Jenny Stanley Staton, the youngest of their ten children. She was sent to live with an older brother in Hackensack, New Jersey at age twelve. She attended and graduated from Hackensack High School.

During the 1930's Frances joined Faith Tabernacle Church of God in Christ in Englewood, NJ under the leadership of the late Rev. Charles "Pop" Gilmore. After the death of Rev. Charles Gilmore she was under the leadership of the late Elder Clarence Gilmore in Paterson, NJ. After the passing of Bishop Clarence Gilmore, Faith Tabernacle was renamed Gilmore Memorial Tabernacle led by his wife the late Reverend Dr. Allene Gilmore. Frances was a dedicated member and faithfully served as a member of the Tabernacle Choir, Pastor's Aide Committee Group Leader and

Treasurer of the Golden Age Club. She was the oldest member. Frances favorite song was "This little light of mine". She later relocated to Paterson, NJ.

In 1942 Frances started working in the garment industry as a sewing machine operator. She then joined the International Ladies' Garment Workers' Union (ILGWU) and soon after became a shop steward for Local 158. A phone-banker in support of the political candidates endorsed by the ILGWU, she was often seen on picket lines and rallies. She was one of the Solidarity Singers of the New Jersey Industrial Union Council singing, "Look for the union label" and playing the tambourine throughout New York and New Jersey. You can hear her on their CD, "Solidarity It Can't Be Beat!" She was active with the ILGWU and the Solidarity Singers as a retiree until age ninety-two.

Twice widowed, Frances married Joseph Clyde Walls at age sixteen. They had two children, Josephine Frances and Joseph Clyde. God smiled on Frances again when she met and married her second husband, James "Jimmy" Ladson with whom she had four children, Austin, Robert, Ledina and Sandra.

She was predeceased by her siblings, John, Napoleon, Walter, Hayes and Hattie, Flossie, infant twins, Sam and her oldest children, Josephine Frances and Joseph Clyde Walls.

On the afternoon of November 6, 2015, four days prior to her one hundredth birthday, Frances passed away peacefully in her home with her daughter, nurse and caretaker, for the six years of her illness, Ledina Ladson and her granddaughter, Terricka Ladson Gardner at her side; son, Austin Ladson, granddaughter, Dillon Ladson, great grandchildren, Andre Jr. and Shamiah Gardner were also in attendance. As afternoon turned into evening the Ladson home in East Orange quickly filled with family and friends surrounding Frances with love as she laid peacefully on her bed after life had left her body and her soul was lifted into heaven.
