Obituary

George James Powell was born on March 15, 1929 in East Harlem, New York to Charles and Mary Shaw Powell, immigrants from St. Kitts and Nevis. George was the fifth of seven children and the only boy.

As a child growing up during the Great Depression, George often looked for ways to help provide for his family. One of his first jobs was selling shopping bags, the start of what would be a lifelong career in sales.

After graduating from Needle Trades High School, George attended City College while working as a tailor at Howard Clothes. There he met his future wife, Mary McIntosh. Mary and George were married on February 12, 1955. Out of this union three children were born: Gregory, Catherine and Roslyn.

Upon leaving Howard Clothes in 1954, George joined Philip Morris' sales force where he would spend his entire career. George held a number of positions at Philip Morris including, Salesman, Division Manager, Section Sales Manager for the State of New Jersey, Assistant to the National Sales Manager and Regional Sales Manager. His last position was Region Vice President which he held when he retired. Following his retirement in 1987, George served as Special Consultant to the Chairman of the Board and Director of Minority Affairs.

While George's professional life was quite impressive, his charitable and political activities were even more so. Whenever possible, George tried to merge the two, most notably when he coordinated efforts by Philip Morris to help Jamaica when it was struck by Hurricane Gilbert in 1988.

George served on the boards of numerous organizations, particularly the Handmaids of Mary, with whom he was associated for more than thirty years. He also served on the Board of Governors of Hackensack University Medical Center from 1989-1999.

George was a Past Master of the Prince Hall Masons FMN and became a 33rd Degree Mason in 1990. He held several other leadership positions and served as president of the following: Fair Housing Council of Bergen County (1970); Urban League of Bergen County (1973-1976); and NAACP of Bergen County (1989-1992). In addition, George was appointed by Governor Nelson Rockefeller to the Selective Service Board in 1966 and was one of the developers of Shirley Chisholm's campaign for Congress in 1967.

George's personal life was even richer. He had friends from all walks of life and would often start a conversation with a perfect stranger. During many of these encounters, it was not unusual for George to learn that he and the stranger knew someone in common, thus beginning even another friendship.

George's family was the most important thing to him, and he stressed that no matter what family came first. He showed his love for them in countless ways and inspired them by his example. But most of all, George loved his wife Mary, his constant companion for almost fifty years. His love for her was boundless and lived on well after her death.

George leaves to celebrate his life: his children, Gregory, Catherine and Roslyn; daughter-in-law, Diane; sons-in-law, Paul and Pedro; grandchildren, Bathsheba, Meserete, Dread-I, Isheryll, Steven, Malik, Dafina, Danilo and Immanuel; great-grandchildren, Madison, William, Noah, Morgan and Jalen; sister, Jane Braxton; niece, Sharen Roberson; and a host of other relatives and friends too numerous to mention.
